

# Prescription Access Options

Can't afford your prescriptions? There may be some resources available for you.

## STEP ONE - FOR IMMEDIATE NEEDS:

### Try \$4 Drug List

See if your medications are on the \$4 list at Walmart. Medications on this list are \$4 for a 30-day supply or \$10 for a 90-day supply. You can look at a list of qualifying medications at this link.

## STEP THREE – FOR FUTURE NEEDS

### Discount Drug Cards and Coupons

**If you are unable to access these programs on your own:**

WAHA staff can:

1. Mail you a copy of the \$4 list
2. Mail you a discount drug card application
3. Look for Prescription Assistance Programs for up to 5 medications per person, per week. WAHA will mail the applications to you. Once received, you (or a support person) will need to be responsible for sending in the applications and re-applying when the PAP runs out.

## STEP TWO - FOR LONGER TERM NEEDS:

### Try Prescription Assistance Programs (PAPs)

Check to see if the pharmaceutical company has a donated or discount program for your drug. This is called a Prescription Assistance Program (PAP). You can do this at [www.needymeds.org](http://www.needymeds.org).

#### **How to use Needymeds.org**

1. Under the "Patient Savings" tab, click on **Brand Name Drugs** or **Generic Name Drugs**. An alphabetical listing appears that contains all the drugs available through PAPs.
2. Click on the first letter of the name of your medicine in the alphabet bar.
3. Next, click on the name of your medicine to access the eligibility and contact information for the program(s).
4. Print the applications and fill them out. In most cases, your doctor will have to fill out a portion of the application.
5. Submit your application to the drug company sponsoring the program
6. Pay attention to how long your PAP is good for. You may have to continue re-applying over time.
